

Wingerworth Parish Council – Anti-Social Behaviour

1. Council's position

The Council, within the extent of its legal remit, is committed to working with its partners to uphold the right of residents of the parish to the legal and proper enjoyment of their property as well as with public space in the parish.

Although the Council's powers are restricted it will encourage and support the appropriate authorities in the exercise of their legal duties to tackle anti-social behaviour as and when it occurs within the Parish of Wingerworth.

The Parish Council is able to help residents by providing advice as to the relevant authorities for dealing with differing forms of anti-social behaviour as it is important that the authorities are made aware of the problems and given the opportunity of resolving them.

2. The Safer Neighbourhood Team

The Council hosts the Wingerworth Safer Neighbourhood Team which includes the Police and any other relevant authorities. The Police present a report on crime and anti-social behaviour in the parish and listen to any concerns and suggestions.

These meetings take place every four months with the date, time and location of the meetings advertised well in advance and residents are encouraged to attend these meetings and be involved in setting Policing priorities for Wingerworth.

The Council will continue to support the Safer Neighbourhood Team as part of its commitment to support efforts to tackle anti-social behaviour.
